

hiladelphia photographer Brian C. Moss will be exhibiting his unique large-scale works at the Painted Bride Art Center, September 1 thru 16 in an exhibition entitled "What helps Dodge helps YOU."

The show is the result of two years of work funded by a grant from the Painted Bride. Moss worked on the site of the abandoned Dodge Steel Castings company near the Tacony-Palmyra Bridge, From scrap metal and illegally dumped trash, he constructed a giant, functioning pinhole camera on the back of a trailer. The camera, some 12 feet high and 10 feet long, was used to photograph the factory's skeleton framework, which is all that remains of the Dodge Steel facility. His camera produced 40 square inch images which Moss has hung in three rows of three imgaes each to produce the

monumental works installed at the Painted Bride.

Following the exhibition, Moss'
"What Helps Dodge Helps YOU" will
be shown as part of of Tacony
History Day at the Disston
Recreation Center on Sept. 18. His
giant camera will be included in a
community parade.
